First Baptist Family,

It's hard to believe that it's already July! It feels as though the first half of the year has flown by. I'm happy to report that we had a strong June. Both our youth and adult mission trips went exceedingly well. Emma did a great job with our Vacation Bible School this year, and much fun was had by all – both children and adults. And we had a wonderful celebratory event on June 30 as we celebrated Baptist Women's Heritage Sunday and recognized the women from the church who have served as deacons, missionaries, and on the church's ministerial staff. My time at CBF's General Assembly was rejuvenating and educational, too. All that to say, June was a good the rest of 2024.

As most of you have probably noticed, things at the church slow down a little bit in the month of July. That's the case this year, too. July is not only a time in which people are trying to get in their last bit of vacation before the school year starts back in August, but it gives us a chance as a staff to catch our breath and fine-tune the plans we have for the Fall. Consequently, I don't have as many events to update you on for this month. Still, there are a few I want you to keep in mind. Please note that we will NOT have a Family Breakfast on Sunday, July 7 since it is only 1 week after our big June 30th celebration. Also, please be in prayer for Ben, our youth, and our adult chaperones as they leave for Camp Unidiversity in Maryville, TN. They'll leave on Monday, July 8 and return on Friday, July 12. Camp week is always one of the highlights of the year for our youth, so I hope you'll join me in praying that they will not only arrive and return home safely but that the trip will be spiritually nourishing and formative for them. Finally, Sunday, July 28 will be Youth Sunday. Our youth will be sharing more about both their mission trip and their camp experiences as they lead us in worship that morning. I know that you'll want to be in church that Sunday in particular.

Because summer is rapidly coming to a close, know that we're finalizing our plans for the Fall and that you'll hear more about them as we get closer to those respective dates. In the meantime, however, I'd like for you to do something for me. If you remember back in the middle of June, I preached on the parable of the growing seed and

the parable of the mustard seed. And at the end of worship, I challenged and encouraged all of you to be on the lookout for the random, ordinary, and unexpected places you saw God's Kingdom sprouting, taking root, and growing. That is what I'd like for you to keep doing. Take pictures of where you see God's Kingdom infiltrating the kingdom of this world. Take pictures of the places where God is creating hope, the places where you sense God at work, even though it might not be obvious or particularly grand. In fact, I want you to pay particular attention to the holy ordinariness of things. And finally, I'd like for you to take pictures of where you see the harvest being brought in. You've got 2 whole month in the life of the church, and it has me excited about months to take and collect these pictures, and then in September, I'd like for you to be prepared to talk about them. On Sunday, September 8, we're going to have Worship and Dinner on the Grounds. Rather than meeting at Steele Creek Park, we're going to have everything outside in front of the Educational Building at the church. I'd like for us to share the pictures you take with everyone, and I'd like for everyone to hear the testimonials that you have to share. I know they will be powerful. Initially, I was going to preach a sermon entitled "Knowing Your Value" that Sunday, but I can think of no better way for us to all know our value than by talking about God's great love and by more closely examining God's peaceable kingdom. There's just no telling who might be moved and inspired by what you see God doing in the world, so bring some folks with you if you can. After all, good things are happening here at First Baptist, and you are the best person to tell others all about it. So, I hope that you will.
