# THE FIRST WORD

#### January 2025

First Baptist Family,

Happy New Year! I hope that you found our Advent services as moving and meaningful as I did. And I hope that your Christmas was a restful and recharging one. Like many of you, Clary, the kids, and I did some traveling to visit family – making our annual trip to visit family in Georgia and South Carolina, respectively. While it's always good to see family, the trip has also renewed my excitement for the new year. I'm excited for the things I believe that God has in store for us in 2025, and I want to tell you about a few of them.

First, however, I want to remind you that Christmas is more than just one day. Rather, it is a season. Now, this reminder is important because Christmas Day actually serves as a launching point for the work of the church. Now that the Christ child has been born and entered into the world, our work, our mission, our effort begins anew. And it is my hope that what we as a church have planned for 2025 will help continue the work of Christmas that Christ began so long ago. In continuing that Christmas work, we're going to ordain and install some new deacons in worship on Sunday, January 19. That is always a meaningful service, especially for the new deacons being ordained and installed. I know it's also meaningful for their families, too, which is why it's my hope that you will be sure to be present in worship that Sunday. Then, the next day, on Monday, January 20, the church will host the community-wide Martin Luther King, Jr. Program. As I'm sure many of you will remember, we hosted this program last year. And like last year, the program will be held in the sanctuary and begin at 2 PM with a reception to follow in Rosser Hall. Any time we can host community events is good, so if you are able to make it, I hope that you'll come for the program that dav as well.

One of the things I'm most excited about in 2025, (and honestly, most nervous about, too) is that I've decided to make some changes to the way I preach. Since I'm going to be trying them for the first time, I want to ask for your patience in advance. Now, there are two primary changes that will be most noticeable to you. The first is that we don't have a yearly theme for 2025. As I'm sure most of you remember, we've had a theme for the year nearly every year I've been here at FBC Bristol, but we're not doing that this year. Rather, I'm going to be doing something I haven't done before preaching sermon series instead. Most of these sermon series are going to be 6 weeks long, though some will be as short as 4 weeks. My thought is that it will be easier for all of us to really focus on the theme of a sermon series than it will be to focus on 1 theme that is referred to periodically throughout the year. Our first sermon series in 2025 is The Mission of Jesus and it will begin on Sunday, January 26. After all, the work of Christmas IS the mission of Jesus. So, beginning with Jesus reading from the scroll of Isaiah there in Luke 4, we're going to journey through Luke's Gospel to see what Jesus' mission is all about. This series will lead us all the way up to Lent.

The other big change I'm making in the way I preach is that I'm going to be incorporating technology in my sermons. Now that we've improved our video capabilities in the sanctuary, we're going to be using them consistently. Some of that will include things like having the words to hymns and praise songs on the screen for people or having the text of our Scripture readings up and visible, but I'm also going to use the screens as part of my sermons. Occasionally, you're going to see a picture of some artwork that was inspired by the biblical text I'm preaching on for that Sunday. I'm also going to have slides that include some textual observations - things from the biblical text that I think are especially interesting or important that I want you to know about - and some points to take home – practical, tangible things you can take with you to help you grow in your walk with Christ.

Now, all of this comes with a bit of a learning curve, both for me and for all of us as a staff as we look for the ways to best and most efficiently use the new capabilities we have while also being true to who we are as a congregation. Like anytime someone learns something new or tries something for the first time, I expect we'll have a few hiccups along the way, especially at first. It's my hope, however, that we'll learn more and get better at it as we go along. Since a new year provides a new beginning, I think this is the perfect time for us to be willing to mix things up a little bit, to be willing to try something new, to be willing to learn and grow – all so that we might see how God is working in us and through us here and now. After all, all of this is for God's glory. So, my dear brothers and sisters, I want to encourage you to do something similar. While I know that many of vou may have New Year's resolutions (which I hope include faithful church attendance and bringing guests with you to worship), I want to encourage you to try something new and be willing to learn and grow for God's sake. For that is one of the ways in which we grow closer to God, and I'm hard-pressed to come up with a better goal for the new year than that.

As always, it is a joy to be your pastor.
